Twyford Neighbourhood Plan Initial Community Engagement

Gilbert Hall drop in meeting

In February 2015, at the start of the process to develop the Twyford Neighbourhood Plan (TNP), a drop-in exhibiton was held in the Gilbert Room of the Parish Hall where villagers were invited to come and make their views known on village issues of concern to them. Panels were displayed to give some background to the neighbourhood planning process and covering topics needing to be addressed in the plan such as housing, environment, traffic, business and amenities

Participants were encouraged to complete an open ended general questionnaire covering the above topics to get community views.

Following this, the TNP committee recognised that it was important to engage more of the community and an outreach process was started to seek opinions from other villagers whilst they were attending clubs, events and group meetings. The same questionnaire as used in the open meeting was taken out to the community.

Graze Festival

The outreach consultations started at the Graze Festival held in August 2015. The committee set up a stall which included the original questionnaire along with a large map of the village. Villagers were asked to place sticky dots on areas which they thought appropriate for further housing. Post-it notes were used to get views on other issues. Information on the village and the neighbourhood plan process were all made available. Responses were validated by a post code to ensure the village connection.

Other consultations

Following on from this consultation, visits were made in a similar style to:-

Orchard Close Residential Home, Twyford Playgroup Committee, Twyford Guides, the Bugle, the Phoenix, Twyford Social Club, St Marys Church, the Methodist Church coffee morning and a Twyford WI meeting

Analysis of Questionnaires

A total of 71 questionnaires were completed and analysed. The questions asked and the analysis of the results are given below.

Questionnaire - Survey Results

This represents the results of 71 questionnaires. Not all questions were answered by everyone and because of the open nature of the survey several points could be made in a sentence. So the numbers are indicative. Where opinions ranged widely the views have been summarized.
