Community Engagement Day

- The first draft of the Twyford Neighbourhood Plan (TNP) was presented to the Twyford Community of 14th September 2016.
- People were invited to Twyford Social Club between 2pm and 8pm to review the Neighbourhood Plan, meet the Technical team who wrote the Plan, and provide their feedback
- The TNP was available on the website from 7th September, and comments were accepted until 6th October.
- Action Hampshire was commissioned to help organise the event, design a questionnaire and collate all responses (which provided some anonymity)

All local people were invited to the Community Engagement event and to comment on the Neighbourhood Plan

- A marketing strategy was designed to try and make everyone in the village aware of the Neighbourhood Plan
- The local email system and Facebook pages were used to advertise the event and plan
- Posters were put up around the village, on public notice boards and other public places
- A banner was put up on the crossroads
- ► The Twyford Neighbourhood Plan website was used to advertise the event

Awareness of the Community Engagement included a leaflet delivered to every house in the village




Action Hampshire gave out questionnaires as people entered. The questionnaires were also made available online

- Other options to return the questionnaire were to post it directly to Action Hampshire, or via a box at the Post Office which was collected by Action Hampshire.
- Action Hampshire reviewed all responses and provided the results to the Technical Team.
- Responses were reviewed and carefully considered by the Technical Team, and some resulted in amendments to the Neighbourhood Plan.
